




# PUNCTUALITY MATTERS

## **EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS**

BEING LATE ADDS UP TO A LOSS OF LEARNING

If you are 5 minutes late every day that adds up to 3 days lost each year.

15 minutes late is the same as being absent for 2 weeks per year.

Homework appears as a block, stretching from the issue date to the due date.




