### YEAR II GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK

On 1st October, 75 Year 11 students headed to Endcliffe Park and urban sustainable communities in Sheffield City Centre. The fieldwork involved students collecting data using a variety of techniques including impact mapping, questionnaires, land use mapping, estimating tree carbon content and bi-polar surveys. All students (and staff!) showed tremendous resilience and good spirits despite the challenging weather conditions.
