End of half term update

As we approach the end of a very busy and productive half term, I am writing to update you on a number of areas, and to share some excellent news regarding our academic performance this summer. I would like to take this opportunity to thank parents for their ongoing support of school throughout this half term. Attendance has again been very strong and is above national and local comparisons. Good attendance is vital for students if they are to achieve their full potential and we value the support that families provide in this area. Many thanks also to families for their fantastic support of our whole school sponsored walk in support of Ashgate Hospice. With the final donations in, the sum raised is £15,532.36, which is an incredible effort.

Brookfield is the top performing school in Derbyshire

The government last week published performance data from the summer 2023 GCSE exams for all secondary schools, sixth forms and colleges. I am delighted to report that Brookfield's performance was once again very impressive. In fact, the published data shows Brookfield to be the top performing school in the whole of Derbyshire.

The main measure the government uses to judge secondary school academic performance is Progress 8 (P8). A school's Progress 8 score compares the progress made by its students (from the end of primary school to the end of secondary school) with all schools nationally. Our P8 score of **+0.51** – along with other performance measures used by the DfE - represents performance which is categorised as 'Well Above Average', the only school in Derbyshire in this category. I know you will agree that this represents outstanding performance. These results improve even on last year's and represent the strongest in the school's history. Alongside our extensive and growing extra-curricular provision, this is a real platform on which future success will be achieved.

Sixth Form Open Evening – Thursday 16th November

Numbers in the Sixth Form continue to grow. In current Year 12 we have almost 150 students. In Year 13 there are more than 100. One of our key events of the year is our Sixth Form Open Evening. This is an exciting opportunity for Year 11 students and parents to find out more about the courses on offer and about what to expect from life in our Sixth Form.
