## Looking for an Apprenticeship 2022 after Y11

### **Apprenticeships**

Are a combination of working with an employer and studying for a related careers qualification (in the work place or going to college or training centre)

Run at several levels -Intermediate Level 2 (GCSE level), Advanced Level 3 (A Level, BTEC Extended Diploma) and Higher and Degree Level 4. Usually Y11 start at Intermediate or Advanced Level

Are for a specific career e.g. Plumbing, Business Admin so check out the careers as well – use <a href="https://nationalcareers.service.gov.uk/explore-careers">https://nationalcareers.service.gov.uk/explore-careers</a> and explore careers on <a href="https://icould.com">https://icould.com</a> . If not sure what career you want use the Buzz Quiz on <a href="https://www.icould.com">https://www.icould.com</a> for suggestions

Are sometimes organised by the company but often arranged with an apprenticeship provider e.g.a private training organization or apprenticeship team within a college or university. Minimum of £4.81per hour but can be more

Vacancies are often competitive so apply for lots. Start looking/applying now through to the summer. Try to get the best GCSE grades you can and have a <u>back-up plan</u> just in case you don't manage to secure an apprenticeship

# Where to look/ What to do now

Register on <a href="www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship">www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship</a> by creating an account. You will then receive vacancy alerts but also check the site regularly for vacancies. Free helpdesk phone line **0800 015 0400** 

Colleges/ apprenticeship providers often advertise on their own websites as well as usually advertising on gov.uk/apply so check these too

Contact local and national companies to ask about vacancies/ send a CV

Check other job seeking websites e.g. Gov.uk (<a href="https://findajob.dwp.gov.uk/">https://findajob.dwp.gov.uk/</a>) Rate My Apprenticeship (<a href="https://www.ratemyapprenticeship.co.uk/">https://www.getmyfirstjob.co.uk/</a>) Get My 1<sup>st</sup> Job (<a href="https://www.getmyfirstjob.co.uk/">https://www.getmyfirstjob.co.uk/</a>)

Talk to family and friends about what you are looking for as they may know companies you can contact or hear of vacancies you can apply for

#### **CVs**

# Things to check if you are talking to an employer/ training provider about apprenticeships

It is very important to find out as much as you can about any apprenticeships you are considering/ are offered. Check out

What work will you do?

Where will you work?

What hours will you work?

Who will organise the apprenticeship – the employer alone or through an apprenticeship provider?

What GCSEs do you need - subjects and grades?

When can you apply?

How do you apply?

What level of apprenticeship is available – Intermediate or Advanced?

What qualification will you study on the apprenticeship?

Where/ how will you study for the qualification?

How long is the apprenticeship for?

What will come after the apprenticeship?

How much will you be paid on the apprenticeship?

#### **Backup Options**

**6**<sup>th</sup> **form courses**. Usually subject based A Levels courses at Level 3 for 2 years

**College Courses**. Various courses, many with a career focus, offered from Entry, Level 1, 2 or 3 for 1 or 2 years. Entry grades vary

**Traineeships.** Short periods of work experience with an employer and can last from 6 weeks up to six months. They may also include English and maths support (if required/needed). **Study Programmes.** These focus on developing personal skills/ confidence, employability skills, English, Maths and include work experience. They last from 6 months to a year.
